Recipe of the Month

Butternut Squash and Turkey Chili

2 (14.5-ounce) cans

beans, drained and

1 (15-ounce) can

2 tablespoons olive oil 1 medium onion, chopped

turkey

- 4 cloves garlic, minced 1 pound ground
- squash peeled, seeded, and cut into 1-inch cubes 1 (4.5-ounce) can chopped

Stovetop: Heat the olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Stir in the onion and garlic; cook and stir for 3 minutes or until onion is translucent. Add ground turkey. Break into pieces and stir until cooked through and no longer pink. Add the butternut squash, chicken broth, green chilies, tomatoes, kidney beans, hominy, and tomato sauce. Season with chili powder, cumin, and salt. Bring to a simmer, reduce heat to medium-low, and cover. Simmer until the squash is tender, about 20 minutes.

1 pound (1 small) butternut 1 cup low-sodium chicken broth green chilies

rinsed Electric Pressure Cooker: Press sauté function. Add olive oil and onion: cook and stir for 3 minutes or until onion is translucent. Add garlic and cook for 30 more seconds. Add ground turkey. Break into pieces and stir until cooked through and no longer pink. Add the butternut squash, chicken broth, green chilies, tomatoes, kidney beans, hominy, and tomato sauce. Season with chili powder, cumin, and salt. Close the lid, and then turn venting knob to the sealing position. Pressure cook at High Pressure for 15 minutes,

allow for a natural release. Open the

lid carefully.

petite diced tomatoes hominy, drained 1 (8-ounce) can tomato sauce no-salt-added kidney 1 tablespoon chili powder 1 tablespoon ground cumin 1/2 teaspoon salt

Yield: 10, 1-cup servings
